Second Harvest North Central Food Bank serves over 100 hunger relief agencies in in North Central Minnesota. We are located in Grand Rapids and administer several programs that distribute over 4 million pounds of donated and purchased food and grocery products directly to individuals and through agencies that serve the needy. Second Harvest supplies the most basic of human needs – Food. Second Harvest North Central Food Bank serves some of the highest poverty areas in Minnesota. An estimated 17,200 different people per month are served by the Food Bank, about 4,400 different people receive emergency food assistance in any given week. The amount of food distributed by the Food Bank rises each year as the number of people coming to our hunger relief agencies continues to increase.



Mobility Mania's mission is to increase accessibility awareness to make Itasca County the showcase of accessibility in Minnesota and to raise finances for local accessibility needs.



Kiesler Wellness Center, known as “Kiesler House” from 1994 until May 2017, was proudly named after Dr. Frank Kiesler. The center’s goal is to assist adults and families who are seeking mental health support for themselves or loved ones. Community members can expect a safe and inviting place to meet friends, learn skills, and access a variety of social activities and events.



New Beginnings Pregnancy Care Center (Caring for Women, Men, Teens and Families) is open Tue-Thurs. 1-6 pm. New Beginnings offer Pregnancy testing, Limited ultrasounds, Prenatal Vitamins, Relationship and Parenting Classes. Parents can use “Parent Points” they earn here at the Center to shop in our Baby Boutique through our Earn While You Learn program. All services are free and confidential. New Beginnings mission is to offer compassion, hope, and help; through the love of Jesus, to empower people and promote life.



KOOTASCA Community Action is a private 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization serving Itasca and Koochiching Counties. Founded in 1965, KOOTASCA helps individuals, families, and communities fight the multiple causes and challenges of poverty. KOOTASCA's mission of "Building Community to End Poverty" is a collaborative effort with our communities to change attitudes and mindsets about poverty, change the systems that affect people in poverty, and engage all community members

in creating a community that provides opportunities for everyone. Through a variety of programs and services, KOOTASCA helps people to help themselves make meaningful change in their lives and journey out of poverty.



Support Within Reach is a private, non-profit, community service organization serving residents and those impacted by incidents of sexual violence in Aitkin, Beltrami, Cass, Clearwater, Hubbard, and Itasca Counties. Our work is made possible by our volunteer Board of Directors, staff, volunteer advocates, and contributors. All of our services are free, confidential, and available to all age groups regardless of gender or sexual orientation, to help them heal from the wounds of sexual violence.



North Homes provide comprehensive mental-health services to keep families together and people connected to their communities. One of our community-based programs is our Children's Therapeutics Support Services and Supports (CTSS) School-based program. CTSS school-based mental health services work to strengthen children and their families through intervention and prevention within a school setting. Youth work on skills and goals aimed at improving functioning at home, school and in the community.
